How do tools help Timimoto explore?

Oral Vocabulary

fetch

Define: When you *fetch* something, you go after it and then bring it back.

Example: My friend's dog can *fetch* sticks and toys.



Ask: What would you *fetch* from the store if you wanted to make a sandwich?

Discuss Read aloud the first two paragraphs on Card I. Then read aloud the last paragraph on Card I. Discuss how the woman felt at first and how she felt later in the day. Ask: Why do the woman's feelings change? What clues tell how she feels?

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Interactive Read Aloud



ENGLISH LANGUAGE LEARNERS

Dramatize Guide children to perform a skit based on the scene on Card 2. Have children play the old man, the old woman, and Timimoto. Encourage children to act out the story as you reread Card 2 aloud. Invite children to talk about the skit and predict what Timimoto will do next.



Timimoto set out on his adventure to **discover** the world. As he was paddling along, he felt <u>something</u> sticky tap his shoulder. He turned and saw a huge frog on a rock behind his boat. The frog was trying to catch him with its tongue!

"Wait!" thought Timimoto. "I have the perfect tool for this!"

He raised his chopstick high in the air and whacked the frog on the nose. The frog dived into the water and swam away.

Later Timimoto arrived at a small village. He saw a crowd of people running toward their houses. He got out of his boat and walked into the village. He spoke to a man who was pushing a cart of vegetables.

"Excuse me, sir. Why is everybody running?" he asked.

The man looked down and said, "You must be new in town, young man. Hasn't anybody told you about the giant who comes out at sunset?"

Suddenly Timimoto remembered what his parents had told him. "This must be where the night giant lives!" he thought. Timimoto thanked the man and raced back to his boat.

Interactive Read Aloud

Oral Vocabulary

discover

Define: *Discover* means "to find out something for the first time."

Example: I did *discover* the first sunflower in our yard.



Ask: What would you *discover* if you cut an apple in half?

tool

Define: A *tool* is something that helps people do work or helps people to learn.

Example: A shovel is a gardener's *tool*.



Ask: Can you name a *tool* that a firefighter would use?



ENGLISH LANGUAGE LEARNERS

Build Background Talk with children about different kinds of tools. Explain that tools are more than just hammers and shovels. Point out that we use tools every day, even at school. For example, pencils, erasers, and crayons are tools. Help children name and describe tools used in school and at home.

Oral Vocabulary

rumble

Define: A *rumble* is a long, low sound like thunder.

Example: The *rumble* of the old man's voice scared me.



Ask: How do you feel when you hear a *rumble* of thunder during a storm?

defeated

Define: When you have defeated someone in a game, you have won the game.

Example: She *defeated* the other runners and won the race.



Ask: How would you feel if you were *defeated* at a game?

Retell

Help children use the pictures to retell the story.

Card I: What is the woman holding? Why is she smiling?

Card 2: Where is Timimoto going? What tools does he take with him?

Card 3: What time of day is it? Who is Timimoto talking to?

Card 4: How does the giant feel? Why does Timimoto hold a needle?
